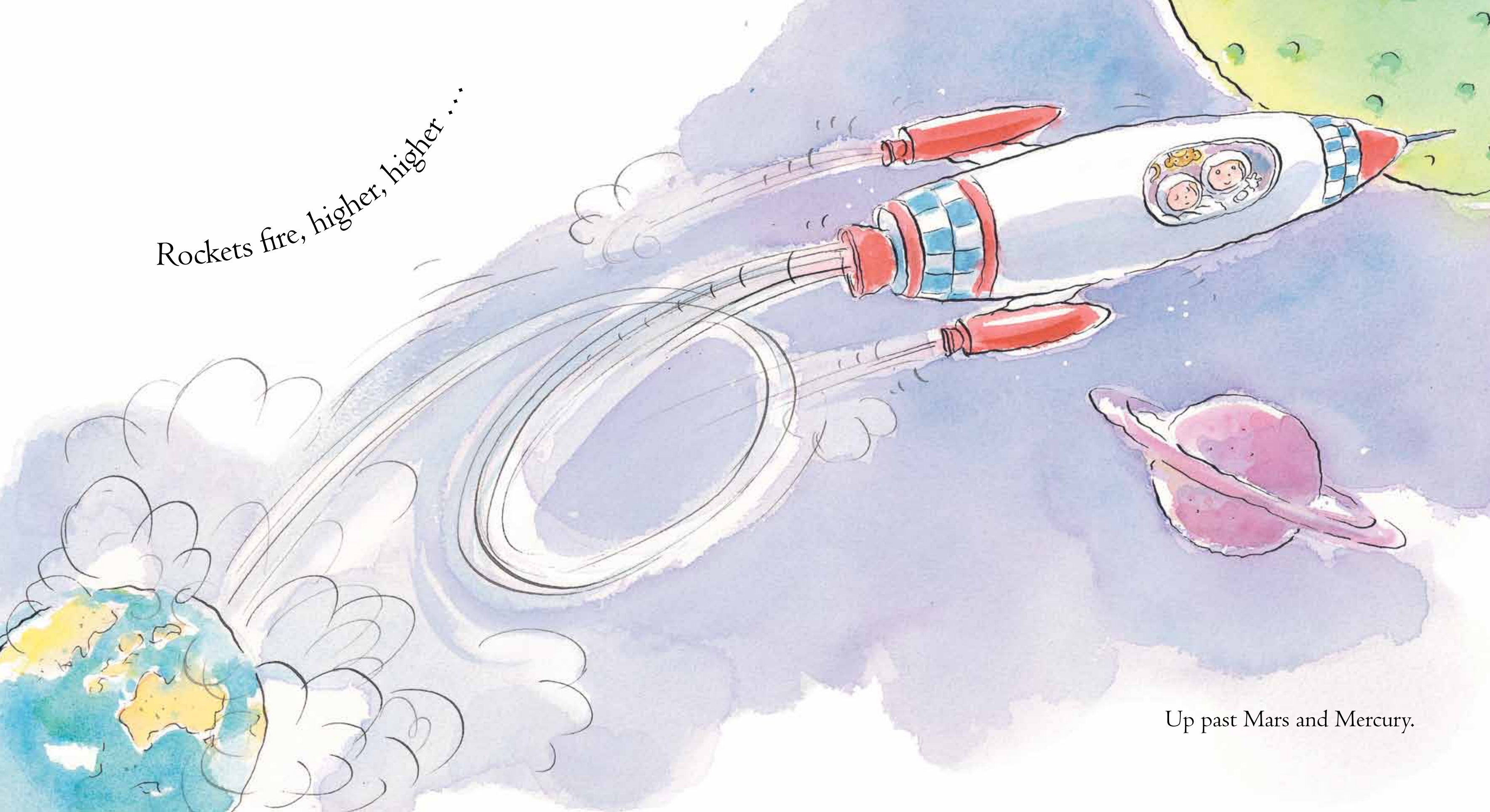
wild dog

Buckled in his booster seat?



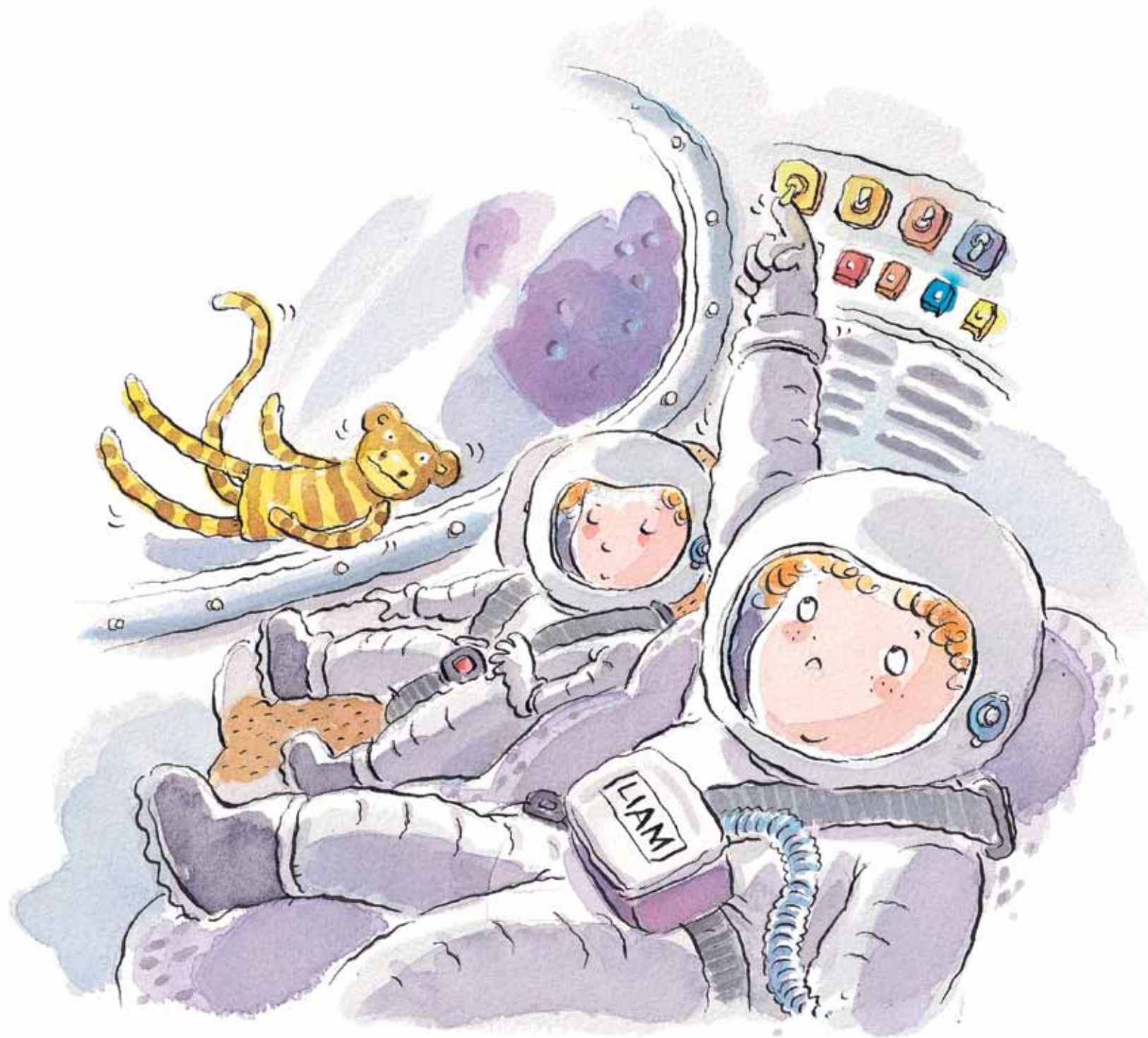
Click clack, in the back,

Rockets fire, higher, higher ...

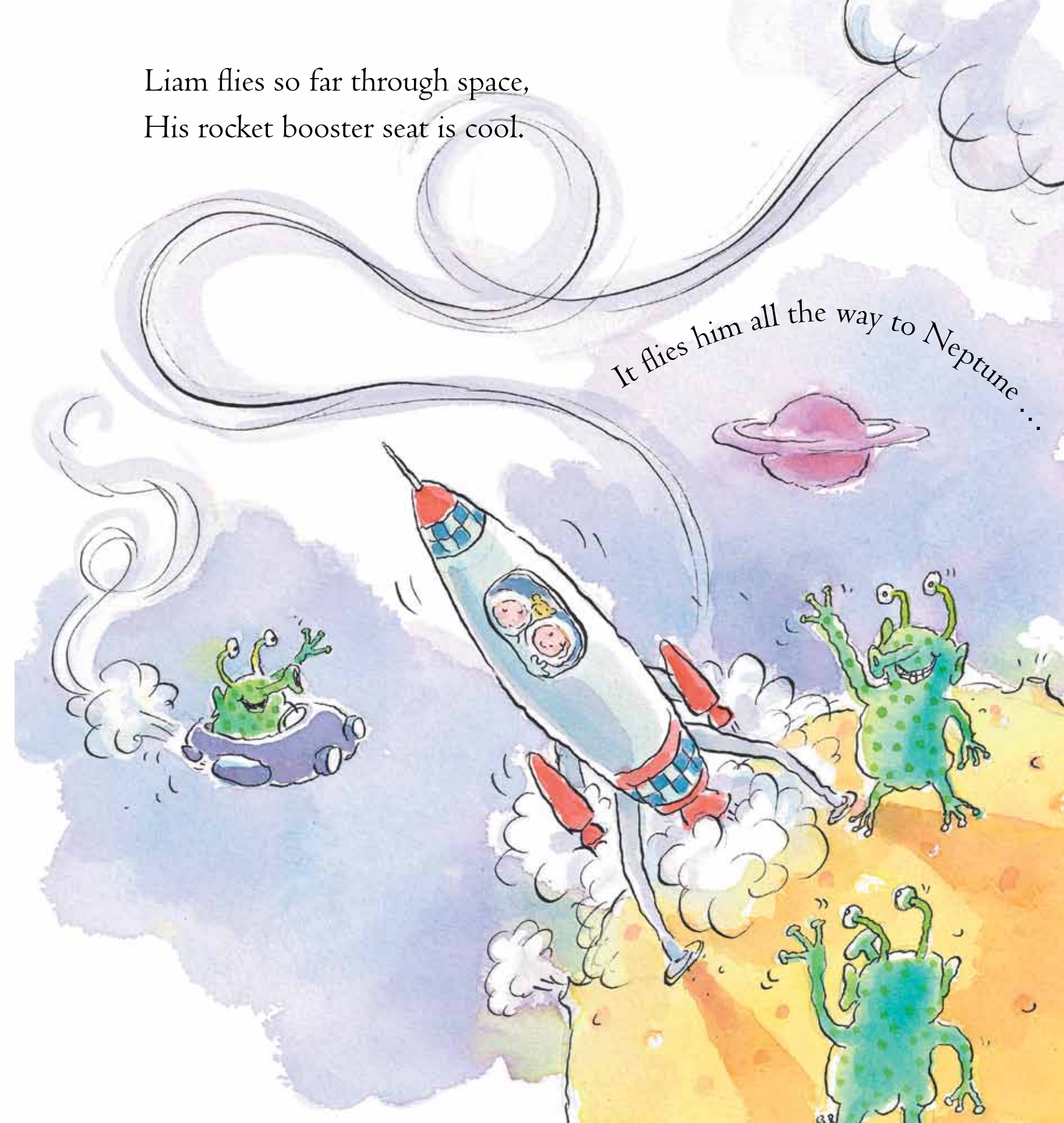


Up past Mars and Mercury.

Danni thinks she's on a ride.



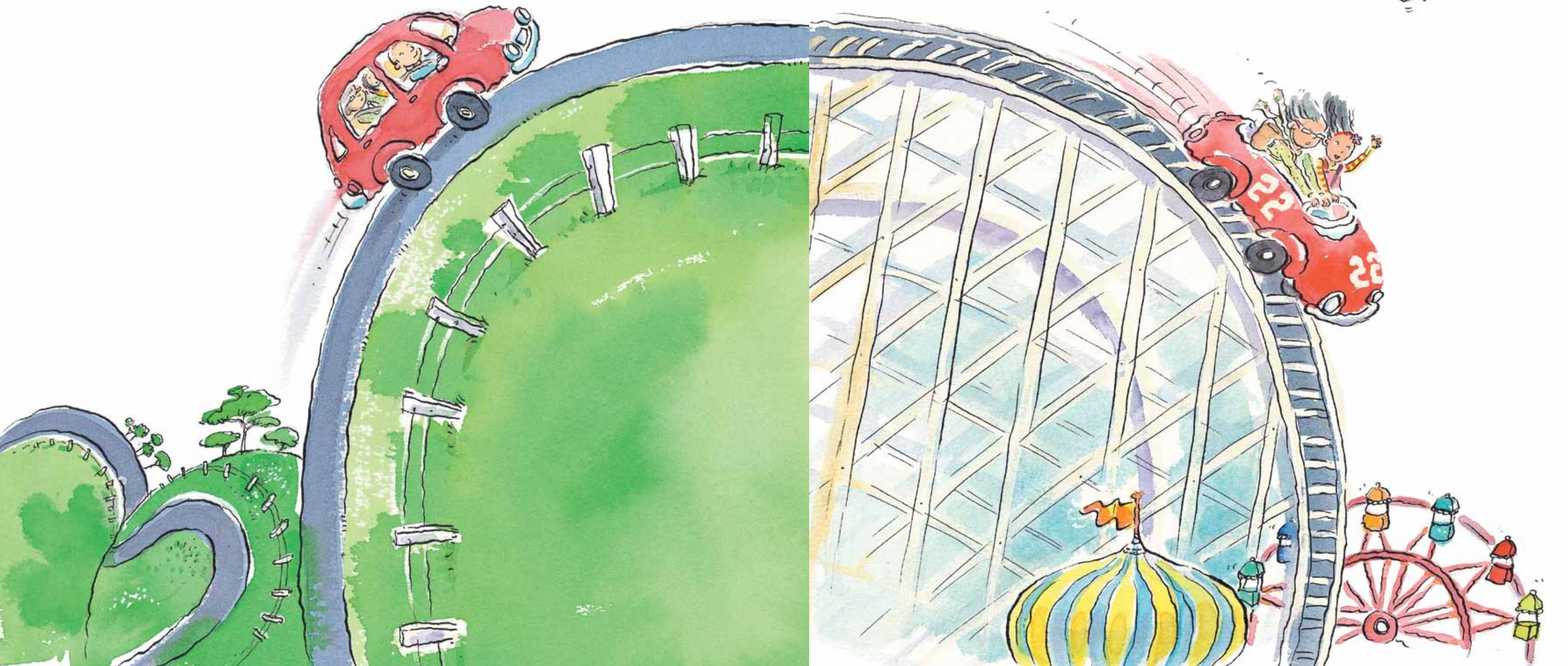
That is where he goes to school.

He likes chilling in the back.

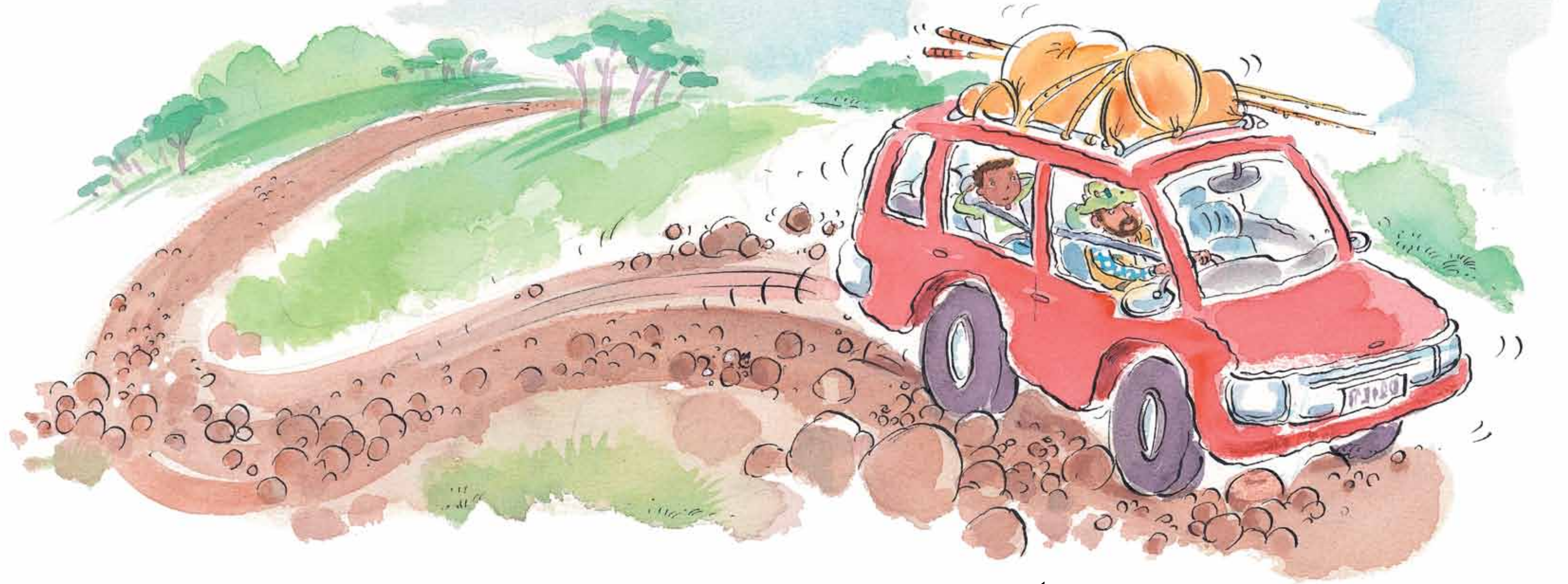


Mum says, "Soula, one more word,
